

*Ahmed had a wedding party. He feels for sorry, because his best friend didn't come to the party.*

*Ahmed says: “**Last year** I had a wedding party. I wanted to invite my best friend Samir. But I lost his phone number, so I couldn't contact him. I really wanted him to attend my party.”*

Why didn't he invite his friend ?

➤ **Ahmed didn't invite his friend him because he didn't **keep his phone number**.**

*If I **had kept** my friend's phone number, I **would have invited** him*

Ahmed says

Choose the right option

Ahmed **expresses** : a. Ambition  b. Regret  c. Complaint

**We use conditional type 3 to talk about :**

**1. Real situations in the past .**

**2. Unreal (imaginative) situations which really didn't happen .**

*If I **had kept** my friend's phone number, I **would have invited** him*

*I **would have invited** him if I **had kept** my friend's phone number.*

## Complete the rule :

### Form

*If + Past Perfect* , + *could*  
*Would + Present perfect*  
*should*

*could*  
*Would + Present perfect* *If + Past Perfect*  
*should*

### Use

We use **conditional 3** with : Conditions or **Unreal (imaginative) situations** in the past that did not happen,  
 To express **Regret** or **Criticism**

### More examples

Your friend didn't pass the exams last year, because **he was not serious in his studies**.

if you ***had been*** serious in your studies , you would ***have passed*** the exams

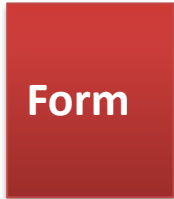
## Form

*If + Past Perfect* , +  $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{could} \\ \text{Would} + \text{Present perfect} \\ \text{should} \end{array} \right.$

$\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{could} \\ \text{Would} \\ \text{should} \end{array} \right.$  *Present perfect* *If + Past Perfect*

## More examples

1. I didn't **send** her an invitation, because I didn't **find** her address.  
→ If I **had found** her address, *I would have sent her an invitation.*
2. They didn't **prepare** well, so they **failed** the exams.  
→ If they **had prepared** well, They wouldn't *have* failed the exams
3. He didn't buy the house, because he didn't have enough money .  
→ He **would have bought** the house if he *had had* enough money



*If + Past Perfect* , +  $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{could} \\ \text{Would} + \text{Present perfect} \\ \text{should} \end{array} \right.$

$\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{could} \\ \text{Would} \\ \text{should} \end{array} \right.$  *Present perfect* *If + Past Perfect*

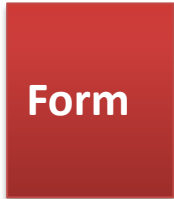

*If + Past Perfect* , +  $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{could} \\ \text{Would} + \text{Present perfect} \\ \text{should} \end{array} \right.$

$\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \text{could} \\ \text{Would} \\ \text{should} \end{array} \right.$  *Present perfect* *If + Past Perfect*

## Conditional type 2

I **don't** have enough money, so I can't buy a laptop

If I **had** enough money, I **would** **buy** a laptop .

Form

If+ **simple past** ,+ **would** + **infinitive**

Use

Conditions which doesn't happen at the present  
Imagine different situation in the present.

# Conditional type 3

## Production: Writing

Write a paragraph about something which you regrets **most**, using conditional type 3.

( *A real/golden opportunity which slipped through your fingers* )

### Topic Sentence Examples :

*Last year ( when you missed the opportunity ) , I missed a real opportunity.*

1. Ahmed *didn't invite* his friend, because he *didn't have* his phone number.  
→ *If he had had* his friend's phone number, he *would have invited* him .
2. I *didn't send* her an invitation, because I *didn't find* her address.  
→ *I would have sent* her an invitation *if I had had found* her address .
3. You *were not* serious in your studies, so you *failed* the exams.  
*If they had been serious* , you wouldn't have failed the exams .

## Form

→ *If + Past Perfect* , +  $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \textit{could} \\ \textit{Would} + \textit{Present perfect} \\ \textit{should} \end{array} \right.$

→  $\left\{ \begin{array}{l} \textit{could} \\ \textit{Would} \\ \textit{should} \end{array} \right.$  *Present perfect* *If + Past Perfect*

## Form

We use **conditional type 3** with conditions (unreal situations) in the past that did not happen, to express **regret** or **criticism**.
